Change at the top.... At the Annual Meeting in May, Councillors chose Nick Greenfield to be Chairman of the Council. Nick has been a Councillor since 2011 and was born and raised in Robertsbridge. He lives in Salehurst with his wife and two daughters, both now at Robertsbridge Community College. Our thanks go to Dicky Clymo, who valiantly stepped in at short notice in January 2013, to lead what was, at that time, a predominantly new team; he has done a sterling job, managing to continue as Chairman of the Planning Committee at the same time (he has been reappointed to this position for the coming year).

You will probably be aware that there will be a general election next year. But did you know that there will also be *Parish Council elections* too? Councillors are appointed for four years and in May 2015 all nine parish council places will be open for nominations (as well as the two Rother District Council posts). Councillors can be nominated for a further term, but new nominations are welcomed and encouraged.

Councils need active, interested and committed people who care about the village and its inhabitants; ordinary folk (no specific skills or qualifications required) to work as part of a team, representing the interests of local residents in a positive and proactive way. So why not consider standing for council? This could be your opportunity to really make a difference to your community.

Advance Warning - A21 Road Closures...

The Highways Agency contractor has advised that they will be carrying out a series of resurfacing work on sections of the A21, including Coopers Corner, Hurst Green, Johns Cross roundabout and Kent Street, which will be done under a *full carriageway closure in both directions*, from Flimwell Crossroads to the A28 junction at Hastings.

All work will take place *overnight between 8pm and 6am, weather permitting, for five consecutive nights from 4th August.* The A268 and A28 will be used as the diversion routes with local access maintained along the A21 for residents (escorted).



Questionnaire results - Developer's Contributions

Thank you to everyone who returned the questionnaire included in the March newsletter. 101 questionnaires were received, giving responses for 187 residents of voting age. This is about 10% of the households and 9% of the adult population in the parish. The full summary ('Developer Contribution Survey 2014 - Summary document') can be found on the parish website, on the Agenda & Minutes of Council Meetings page. This was sent to Roger Comerford, the Principal Planning Officer at Rother District Council on 8th May 2014 - everyone's comments were included. Here is a reminder of Questions 1-9, and a barchart of the responses to them.

- Q1 New 'health centre' premises for current doctors and dentists surgeries
- Q2 Extension for over-subscribed Robertsbridge Childrens' Services
- Q3 Skateboard ramp (half-pipe)
- Q4 BMX track
- Q5 Financial help towards a Highways review of parking restrictions and yellow-lines
- Q6 Facility / classroom improvements at the Primary School
- Q7 Robertsbridge Community College (unspecific support)
- Q8 Equipped Fitness Gym
- Q9 Arts facility

CUTS, CUTS – it seems that everything these days is being cut – except the one thing we would really like cut – the grass on our verges and roadsides!! You have probably noticed that this is not happening nearly as often any more, along with weed killing on pavements and road edges. These functions are the responsibility of East Sussex County Council and cuts to their budget have resulted in less frequent cuts for the grass! The Parish Council is in discussion with them to try and improve the situation, but in the meantime, if you find that long grass on a verge is affecting visibility and therefore—safety, please report it to ESCC on 0345 60 80 193 or via their 'report-a-fault' at www.eastsussex.gov.uk

WE NEED YOUR VIEWS... Do you use the parish bus shelters? - There are two bus shelters in the village: George Hill and Northbridge Street (near Rutley Close), and both are in poor condition. The Parish Council is currently considering whether to replace, repair or remove these. A new bus shelter costs over three thousand pounds. It would be very helpful get an idea of how well-used these stops are, and how important (or not) residents feel bus shelters are.

In case you are wondering why there aren't shelters at other popular stops in the village, it is generally because they would not comply with the regulations about minimum pavement width: a shelter *including its roof* must be at least 500 mm clear of the kerb edge, and the walkway must not be reduced to less than 1000 mm (1 metre). Realistically that means a pavement of at least 1.8 metres wide for even a narrow cantilever design shelter.

Wheelie bins - What happens from 30th June?

Here's a reminder of the imminent changes to your rubbish & recycling collections (you should also receive information, including collection days, direct from Rother District Council).

The <u>NEW BROWN</u> wheelie bins are for your garden waste in future - only people who registered *and* paid the first annual £25 by the deadline will have received one. If you registered but have not paid, RDC will have kept your registration on file and they'll contact you when they can provide the service. If you did not register but now would like to, register for the next 'phase' at www.rother.gov.uk/gardenwaste - this will commence when there is sufficient demand from residents. In the meantime, you will need to either compost your garden waste or take it to your local household waste recycling site.

Your <u>OLD GREEN</u> wheelie bin will become used for recycling tins, cans, plastic (bottles, tubs, wrappers and trays), Tetra-Pak cartons, paper and cardboard. Not glass! If you do not have one, you can request one at www.rother.gov.uk/contactus. Your <u>RECYCLING BOX</u> will become used for glass bottles and jars.

Your **BLACK wheelie bin** will still be for other general waste/rubbish.
