May saw the election of a brand new Parish Council and details can be found on later pages. Four Councillors decided not to offer themselves for re-election this time – Dicky Clymo, who served as both Vice Chairman and Chairman during his term, Neil Barden, Nigel Lockwood and Keith Marden and we thank them for their time and work for the village over the years.

As only seven people put themselves forward for the nine places, they were automatically elected (without a poll), leaving two vacancies. Four excellent candidates subsequently came forward and two were chosen by the Councillors to join the team. Our thanks go to the two who were not successful this time, for offering their services; perhaps there will be an opportunity for them in the future.

We also had District Council elections, and Sue Prochak and Graham Browne were re-elected. We congratulate them and look forward to continuing our close working relationship.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN: update





As a result of our request for all possible housing sites in the village to be declared to us, all the already known developers have confirmed they wish to have their sites considered (Croudace at Grove Farm, Devine Homes on Bishops Lane, Westridge Country Crafts site on George Hill and developers for the Mill Site).

But our request has brought forward other possible development sites. The Steering Group and the Housing Group have already interviewed owners and developers over two evenings and have a third set of interviews in the middle of June. You will have an opportunity to see their proposals on 4th July; full details are shown in the box on the front cover.

We genuinely believe that where the 155 new homes are to be built within the village is the most critical element in the Neighbourhood Plan, and your views are vital.

We are liaising with Rother District Council, and will be talking to all the adjoining parishes and to the High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty Unit, because we want to hear what they say about our plans as well.
