

Upgrading our amenities

During lockdown the Parish Council has been busy upgrading our local amenities. We have refreshed the plant pots at Pipers Field and Jubilee Gardens., and also ordered new dog



bins for Fair Lane and Heathfield Gardens, replacement grit bins, and a new noticeboard for Bishops Meadow.

In addition, we hope that you will be impressed (next time you need to spend a penny) by the complete overhaul of the toilet block at the Station Road car park. The building has been upgraded from top to bottom and features more modern, efficient and sanitary fittings. The water supply has also been repaired to resolve a pressure issue. If you

This is one of the biggest capital expenditures we have carried out and reflects our belief that the provision of such services to
